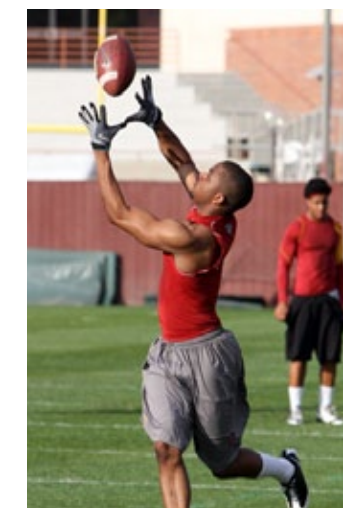

Martell played in a college offense that rarely featured the tight end in the passing game - which explains how a player who saw action in 40 games has so few receptions.

Despite his receiving statistics at Michigan, which were clearly low due to the system, Martell knows how to catch a football:

Coming out of high school, Martell had 65 career receptions for 1,362 yards and 25 touchdowns. He was selected to the USA Today All-Second team as a receiver, was a PrepStar Magazine All-American, was a four-star recruit, and was rated the No. 20 receiver in the nation by Scout.com and the No. 29 receiver in the nation by Rivals.com.

Martell's size, willingness to block, and ability to catch will make him an outstanding prospect in the NFL. Had he played in a different system, we'd be talking about him as a no-doubt draft pick.

## Agent's Notes

Michigan's offensive system asked its tight ends only to block - which means that he is probably the best blocking tight end in the draft.

That said, Martell is an excellent receiver with very good hands and crisp route running abilities. At the NFL level he will have no problem as a receiving tight end, and

his blocking abilities have never been in doubt. He's an excellent athlete who is ideally suited to his position.
